Staying on one topic during an argument is important for several reasons: (use a notebook to write down other topics that come up to be discussed later)

- 3. Effective Communication: Staying on topic promotes effective communication. It ensures that each participant understands the specific points being discussed, reducing the chances of miscommunication or misunderstandings.
- 4. **Avoiding Escalation:** Bringing up unrelated issues or going down rabbit holes can escalate the argument, making it more emotionally charged. Staying focused on one topic helps maintain a more constructive and controlled conversation.
- 5. **Time Management:** Discussing one issue at a time allows for more efficient use of time. It prevents the argument from becoming lengthy and exhausting, making it easier for participants to stay engaged and committed to finding a resolution.
- 6. **Building Trust:** Focusing on one topic demonstrates a commitment to addressing and resolving specific concerns. It can build trust between the parties involved, as it shows a willingness to engage in a meaningful and focused dialogue.
- 7. **Preventing Deflection:** Going down rabbit holes or introducing unrelated topics can be a way to deflect attention from the original issue. By staying on one topic, you discourage deflection and keep the conversation centered on the matter at hand.

Remember that effective communication is key in any argument or discussion. Being mindful of the topic at hand and working towards a mutual understanding can lead to more productive and positive outcomes.
